It's Show Time!!

Do you want to learn more about orchids and which varieties grow best in our area? Would you like the opportunity to purchase plants and products from out-of-state vendors? How about getting in touch with your artistic or organizational side? Or possibly winning awards? If you said yes to any of these questions, WE NEED YOU!

The Spring is the major season for orchid shows all through the Gulf Coast area. The societies, like BROS, schedule local shows and invite other societies to participate. If we accept, a team gathers members' blooming plants on the Thursday before the show and prepare them for display. Members take turns setting up the displays and taking them down. There are opportunities to network with other growers and vendors (who are usually experienced growers) and learn tips on being successful. It's a lot of fun!

Update on World Checklist

The following information has been shared by Jean Ikesen:

Tried using the World Checklist of Selected Plant Families lately? You won't find it. It was taken down late this fall. Why? It has been replaced by a new platform that combines the data from the WCSP with IPNI and others to create Plants of the World Online. This is an expanded and more flexible platform that will, over time, offer additional flexible searches as they add to it. Currently it has photos for some species, geographic range map, validly described synonyms and accepted varieties, forms and subspecies. Also photos and locations of herbarium specimens when available. A forthcoming Judges Corner in Orchids tells you more. powo.science.kew.org

This is THE source for accepted or validly published names of orchid species. Bookmark it as you may need it at the judging table or doing research.
